## The Afghan Family Update

Our Afghan family has been busy since their arrival in Little Rock late last spring. They are a family of 8; a mom & dad, and their 6 children, and are settling into their new life here in the USA. Dad Ali works full-time as a baker in a local hospital, where he drives himself to and from work 5 days a week. Mom Liaqa manages the household and rises early each morning to bake bread and prepare lunches for the rest of the family. Since Ali reports to work very early in the morning, Liaqa also is responsible for getting the school-age kids out the door to meet their respective buses, all while tending to a toddler and 4-month-old baby! Liaqa is an excellent seamstress and attends a monthly sewing group made up of other Afghan women in the area. She wants to learn to drive.



Nazir (boy) is a 7<sup>th</sup> grader and recently made his school’s soccer team. He speaks English well and often serves as the family interpreter. He is doing well while navigating becoming a teenage boy in America. Lima (girl) is in 5<sup>th</sup> grade and recently ran for and won a seat on her school’s student council! Her family is so proud of her- and so grateful

- 4) Recognize children as a gift from God, not just the future of the Church; they are the Church, and they are the present of the Church

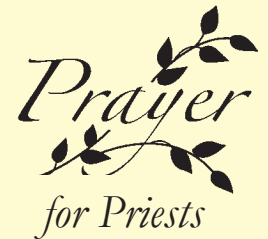

for opportunities she would not have had in her native country. She also won a Black History Month contest with her depiction of the first hairbrush with synthetic bristles. Shabir (boy) is in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. His teacher reports that he is an excellent and hardworking student. Mohammed is a first grader- and he is also working hard in school. Marwa (girl) is 3 years old and is becoming more and more comfortable with speaking English. Marwa will be joining Holy Souls in the PreK 3 program as a baby Wabbit. Baby Mustafa is smiling and cooing and enjoying the attention of a big, loving family.

Holy Souls is fortunate to sponsor this family and be part of their resettlement process. As one can imagine, they have had a long, hard road to get to Little Rock. The Mirzae family's story is one that they will share with you, and one you should visit with them about. After hearing their story, you will be able to count the many blessings in your life. Some may not know, but it typically takes 2-3 years for a refugee family to fully resettle in the community. The goal with resettlement is for Little Rock to become their home for the long-term. They live here, work here, go to school here, give back to the community here and love it here. With the Afghan resettlement in Arkansas, Central Arkansas received a total of 12 families, which different churches agreed to sponsor in their resettlement process.

The family's native language is Dari, with some understanding of Pashto. All of the school-age children are enrolled in after-school English classes, and Ali and Nazir attend a men's English class 3 times a week. Like most families with young children, they are a busy household but they love to have visitors! In their culture, it is perfectly normal to drop by to say hi, and they will graciously serve you tea and a snack.

As you can imagine, there are MANY needs for a family of 8 that has only one car and speaks English as a 2<sup>nd</sup> (3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup>) language. The (Mirzae) sponsor team would like to appeal to more parishioners of Holy Souls to please donate your time and talents to assist this wonderful family in resettling. The Mirzaes still require assistance with a wide range of needs- such as needing tutors over the summer to continue working with the children with their English, or as small as stopping by to introduce yourself and letting the family know you care. Their current needs include:

- A dentist that would offer services at a discounted rate to Ali and Liaqa. They need multiple extractions and partials. The children are seen at a local pediatric dentist and are covered by ArKids.

- Anyone this summer (teacher, high school or junior high student) to volunteer once a week to work with the children on their English.
- An ESL volunteer to work closely with Liaqa. Her goal is to get her driver's license and expand her English.
- Babysitters to sit with Marwa and Mustafa while Liaqa attends doctors' appointments. Marwa and Mustafa are the EASIEST children to babysit.
- Transportation to and from appointments. You don't have to speak Dari, translate the appointment or even attend the appointment. You can drive and drop off. Both Liaqa and Ali have cell phones and call when they are done and ready to be picked up.
- Men to reach out to Ali and help teach him how to perform upkeep and small repairs for the home and car. He would love some added socialization with men.

The family loves to have fun! They have been to Catholic High football and basketball games, bowling, and to Spirit Night at their school! It would be great if our parishioners would like to invite them to join a nature hike or picnic, watch a movie or fireworks, or visit a park or sporting event.

The sponsorship team greatly appreciates you praying and reflecting upon your time and talents, and then offering to help us with the Mirzae family. Please feel free to reach out to any one of us with questions, or contact Wendy Floriani at the church office 501-663-8632.

## Grateful Stewards of God's Gifts...

*It is impossible for us not to speak about what we have seen and heard.*

Acts 4:20

Pope Francis frequently reminds the faithful that, regardless of their vocation or station in life, they are all called to proclaim Jesus to the world. For disciples, evangelization is not an option. Having encountered the love of God and seen for ourselves the incredible things Jesus has done for us, we cannot help but want to share that news with others so that they may come to know Jesus and encounter His saving power. Of course, most of us won't go to foreign lands or stand on street corners proclaiming the name of Jesus. Rather, most of us will proclaim the good news through small deeds, encouraging words and the radical love we show our friends, family members, and neighbors.

An excerpt from *Living Faith*

The mission statement of the Catholic Church is to evangelize. As Catholics, we are called to be disciples of Christ. The word, evangelization, is sort of scary to Catholics because it sounds so protestant. All it really means is to preach the Gospel or spread the Word of God. Like the reflection says, most of us aren't preachers or clergy or missionaries but we can evangelize. I remember a parishioner, Phil Carroll, saying at a Parish Council Retreat in Subiaco many years ago, that we can evangelize simply by the way we live. He was a wonderful man (God rest his soul,) who did live his life by sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with others by example, not only with words but with his actions. We can serve God in the parish and in the community, living life as Christ has called us to live, setting good examples of a merciful, loving nature are all ways to evangelize. We don't have to knock on doors, but that is an option!

The Mission of the Catholic Church and its preamble are as follows: *"Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists to evangelize."*

*"The mission of evangelization is entrusted by Christ to his Church to be carried out in all her forms of ministry, witness, and service. By evangelizing, the Church seeks to bring about in all Catholics such an enthusiasm for their faith that, in living their faith in Jesus and strengthened by the sacraments, most especially the celebration of the Eucharist, they freely share that faith with others to transform the world."*

## The Tapestry Behind the Altar

The Renaissance Committee of Our Lady of the Holy Souls Church in 1999 commissioned Tapestry Artist Ulrika Leander of Oak Ridge, Tennessee to design this tapestry as part of the renovation of our church.

Ulrika was born in Sweden. Her first experience with tapestry was when she was thirteen years old and recovering from an illness. To entertain herself, she made her own small tapestry. She had watched her mother weave all her life, but she says, “I thought I had discovered a new form of art. I still have that little tapestry.” All through high school, Leander took “every course I could that had anything to do with threads.” She then went to Stockholm to study for five and half years with internationally known teachers. She moved to Tennessee with her family and set up a studio there. That studio contains two looms; the larger is fourteen feet wide with a weaving width of twelve and a half feet. The custom made loom was biggest one of its kind in the eastern United States at the time.

Leander creates tapestries for businesses and private collections, but her heart is in liturgical art. Of the design for Holy Souls said said, “I personally think it’s one of the most beautiful I have ever made. I think it’s going to be pretty ‘delicious.’”. The inspiration for the design came from Psalm 141: **“Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening sacrifice.”** While she was creating it, she was somewhat secretive about the final design, but she indicated that the tapestry portrays incense smoke curling into an evening sky. The colors are rich and vivid, employing yarns from as far away as Australia.

She said, “I feel very privileged to have this occupation. It is a gift I have to share. I get emotional when I work on a tapestry for a church. I don’t think you could do this work without your belief and without emotion. Because of all the artists working on this church, I have a feeling that Our Lady of the Holy Souls Church will be known for its beauty.”

Many people do see the incense and prayers rising up, but others see the face of Christ in it. What do you see?

It has always been “our” plan to expand Holy Sews’ services to as many heartbroken families as possible, but at the same time, we realized a long time ago that we cannot make “a plan” for Holy Sews. A deliberate choice was made in the beginning to simply trust the Holy Spirit – just as Mary and Joseph trusted God.

We have been overwhelmingly reminded that our gifts – like the birth of Jesus – are meant to bring comfort and peace. During the season of celebrating THE gift, we received orders for 2,000 layettes, and the orders rose to 5,000 layettes during January. Were we overwhelmed? Yes, but we never worried. We simply rallied the troops (our faithful and dedicated volunteers), and we went to work. God does not call the equipped, he equips the called. We have always had enough for God’s plan at any given moment. Our volunteers are always working to create layettes and package them for distribution. They are TRULY the hands and feet of Christ.

And at this moment in time, we are dedicated to gift our burial layettes to hospitals so that each grieving family has a choice for the only clothing their baby will ever wear. Clothing the body of Christ in the most vulnerable form is our sacred calling and mission—one which we do not take lightly.

If you have received a Holy Sews layette—we are so sorry for your loss. Please know that you are not alone. You and your family endured the unimaginable. Please rest assured, knowing that you helped deliver a perfect soul straight to heaven.

How and why did the big surge happen? The first surge was the result of relationships we established at the **Pregnancy Loss and Infant Death Alliance** Conference we attended in Denver, Colorado, in October. The second surge a few days later came

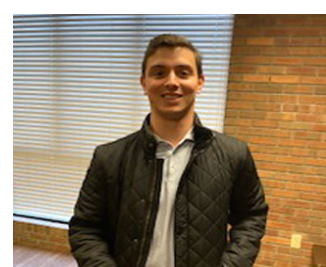
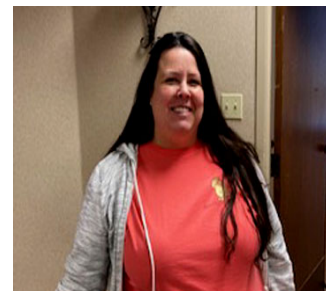

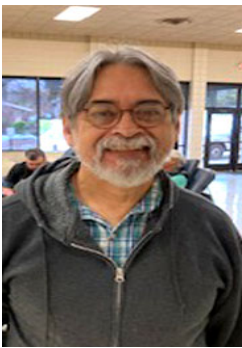
