





## JESUS ANSWERED HIM,

"Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests,

### CALLED BY GOD

We return to Ordinary Time this Sunday, and with this new season we focus on what it means to be a person who is called by God for some definite purpose. Elisha recognized God's call in Elijah's greeting and prepared immediately to follow. The people who came to Jesus seemed ready to follow, yet each had reasons to linger behind. As people who are given the freedom to follow or to stay behind, we must ask ourselves what we are ready to do for the sake of Christ and the call of the gospel. What are you called to do at this time in your life? Are you prepared to leave behind the things that get in the way of living as a Christian?

### FOLLOW

What does it mean to follow Jesus? The Gospels show us that Jesus called each person individually, recognizing the things that stood in the way for each. He looked into the person's heart and saw the true desires of the person standing before him. Each of us experiences Christ's call uniquely as the persons we are. For some, following requires us to take stock of our lives and let go of the obstacles that keep us from the way of true discipleship. For others, the call may lead us to deepen the way that faith directs our lives, with more intentional time in prayer, regular participation in Mass, renewed attention to family, involvement in our parish, or new acts of service.

### BE READY

It is easy to say we want to follow Jesus, yet most of us feel competing desires that stand in the way of discipleship. We may be distracted by the constant swirl of activity so prevalent in our surrounding culture; we might be lured by worldly wealth and the status that often accompanies it; we may simply be comfortable with the way things are and find it difficult to risk changing anything. In today's Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that we must stop putting off making the changes that will bring us closer to him and to God's way of life. We must trust in the Lord, knowing that what he most deeply desires is that we be close to him. If you encountered Jesus today and said you were ready to follow him, what would he see in your heart, what obstacles or hesitations would he perceive? Go to Jesus in prayer this day. Listen to him say, "Follow me." Prayerfully place your life in the Lord's hands and be ready to follow.

# Arkansas' Eucharistic Revival Begins

Bishop Anthony Taylor's Homily on The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), June 19, 2022

Today we begin a 3-year national process of Eucharistic Revival during which we seek to grow in our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist, the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of Jesus whom we receive and worship in every Mass. It seems that there are many Catholics who do not understand or believe in Jesus' real—not merely symbolic—presence in the Eucharist. And since our faith is reinforced more by what we do than by what we say, I would like to launch this Eucharistic Revival in Arkansas with an invitation for all of us to consider what we can do to better express our faith in the manner of our worship.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes "the Eucharist as the 'source and summit' of the Christian life" (CCC 1324-1327). We encounter Jesus in the most intimate way possible, receiving him into our very self. And then, filled with his enduring presence, we are sent forth to be his living presence in the world today. Everything we do in the Church flows from this encounter with the Lord, and our awareness of his presence should especially be reflected in our manner of dress and in our conduct in the Church proper. So, for instance, what would you wear if you had an audience with the Pope? I'll bet you'd wear your Sunday best! Well Jesus is greater than the Pope, and Jesus is here! For that reason, I would like to begin this Eucharistic Revival by asking all of us to reflect on how our actions give witness to our faith in Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist we celebrate and receive.

The first step is to consider what we can do to better prepare ourselves internally for what we are to receive. This will include fostering a spirit of reverent silence in the Church before Mass, as well as active participation throughout the Mass. Blessing ourselves with holy water upon entering the sacred space, genuflecting or bowing before entering the pew and then kneeling down to offer a short prayer before taking a seat. These simple gestures give witness to our belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. I invite you to reflect on the manner in which Communion is received—making a throne to receive the Lord if receiving on the hand, one hand on top of the other, or on the tongue—your choice—and if receiving the Precious Blood, to do so very carefully. Starting today, to the degree that local circumstances permit, parishes are now free to resume offering the Precious Blood to the congregation. Jesus is fully present in the Eucharist when received only in the form of bread, but the sign is more complete when both elements are received.

As for the reception of Communion, each of us needs to make sure that there is nothing in our life that prevents us from receiving the Eucharist: you have to be a Catholic, you need to be in a state of grace, with no unconfessed mortal sins, you must fast at least one hour before Communion, you can't be in a sexual relationship with

someone to whom you are not married in the Church, and so on. If you are in any of these situations, you can receive a blessing at Mass instead of Communion. You come up with your arms folded across your chest, which will signal to the minister to give you a blessing instead of Communion. If you are in this situation, I invite you to speak with your priest, who will help you address whatever issues are keeping you from receiving our Lord in the Eucharist. And in the meantime, he can also help you learn how to make a spiritual communion.

The Eucharist should draw us into Jesus' very act of self-giving, such that we increasingly give of ourselves to God and to others in union with Jesus. We offer ourselves in union with Jesus to the Father from the altar during Mass, and having done so, we proceed to offer ourselves in union with Jesus to the Father in loving service. In this way, the vertical and horizontal are inseparably linked in the "breaking of the bread." Christ invites us to enter into his sacrificial love and then allow ourselves to become "bread that is broken" for others!



## EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2025

Pope Francis has designated the next three years as a time to be "set on fire" with love for the Eucharist.

### YEAR OF DIOCESAN REVIVAL

June 19, 2022 – June 11, 2023

This first year of the Revival invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to respond to the Lord's personal invitation and equips them to share this love with the faithful through Eucharistic congresses and events.

### YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL

June 11, 2023 – July 17, 2024

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit.

### YEAR OF GOING OUT ON MISSION

July 21, 2024 - Pentecost 2025

Having enkindled a missionary fire in the hearts of the American faithful, the Holy Spirit will send us out on mission to share the gift of our Eucharistic Lord.



# *Grateful Stewards of God's Gifts . . .*

*"No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."*   Luke 16:13

When the collection basket passes you by at church, what are you thinking? The reality is that your spiritual health is tied into what you think and what you do with your money. People like to say that stewardship doesn't have anything to do with money. But the reality is that money is such a strong force in our lives that if we relegate it to something outside of our spiritual journey, it has the potential to sneak up on us and take control before we know it. I heard a long time ago a P.T. Barnum quote, "Money is a terrible master but an excellent servant." The truth is that unless we exercise true dominion over our money and allow it to serve God's purpose, then we run the risk of waking up one day being enslaved by it.

I heard on the radio station this morning on the way to work one of the commentators on the show say that she wanted to make big money to be rich because that's what matters, that's where it's really happening. So when I read this excerpt I thought of her and about others that think being rich is where happiness is. I can tell you because I have lived it. Living from paycheck to paycheck is not fun. Worrying about paying bills can be hard on a marriage. In our culture having money, buying nice things, driving a fancy car are all signs of success but that does not necessarily bring us happiness or joy. Serving God, answering the call to help others, supporting our church, helping others in need, trusting God will take care of us. That is happiness and that brings joy. Going to Adoration and spending quiet time with God, that brings great peace and joy.

We have the opportunity to help an Afghan family. The family has seven members and one on the way. There are various ways to be helpful and good Stewards. We need volunteers for transportation to medical appointments, assistance in securing WIC, purchasing clothing for the adults and the children, basics for the house, taking them grocery shopping, etc. Donating money is wonderful but hands and feet, people are also definitely needed. 
