

PREPARING FOR LENT

As we approach the season of Lent, Paul's first letter to the Corinthians gives us a sneak peek of Easter, waiting for us on the other side: "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" Paul's conclusion, telling us to remain steadfast and devoted to the Lord's work, could serve as a Lenten motto. The reading from Sirach provides a series of adages regarding discipline of the tongue, and of our speech. Maybe not a bad Lenten practice to observe. Even Jesus in Luke's Gospel gets into the act, encouraging a cleansing of the heart ("A clean heart create for me, God" we will sing in Psalm 51 during Lent), so that from the goodness of our heart we will bring good into the world. Of course, these insights from Sirach, Paul, and Luke serve us quite well year-round. What we truly do "in the Lord" is never done in vain.

IS THIS ON THE TEST?

Today's reading from Sirach reminds us not to praise others before they speak, "for it is then that people are tested." Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, takes it a step further, reminding us that we are also known by the fruit borne in our lives. It doesn't take long to think of a person or group of people who speak beautiful, praiseworthy words, and yet their lives are unfruitful, or their lives outright contradict their speech. This is the class of people we call "hypocrites," and it's clear in all the Gospels that Jesus has no time for them. Our speech does test us, but the test is really to demonstrate that there is a connection between what we say and how we live. Expressed another way, this is the age-old discussion about faith and works. A truly deep-rooted faith will bear fruit in the works, in the actions of our lives. As happens so often in discipleship, we are dealing with the both/and, not either/or.

TALKING HEARTS

As disciples who follow Jesus, we believe that we are following God's very Word-made-Flesh. The theological term for this is In-carn-ation, the "in-flesh-made" second person of the Trinity. As followers of the Word, our words are truly important. Our hearts and mouths are wired together, as Jesus tells us today: "from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks." This is yet another echo of the wisdom of Sirach: "Speech discloses the bent of a person's heart." Eventually, our words—and the other actions of our lives—will convey what is truly in our hearts. Perhaps the ultimate test of our discipleship is not merely our words, or even our actions, but on a deeper level the test is whether or not others will find in us God's word "in-flesh-made." Our mission is to be the Word-made-flesh, in the flesh again in our own place and time.

Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States. The obligation to abstain begins at age 14. The law of fasting is for those between the ages of 18 & 59.

Parents and teachers are asked to educate those not bound by the laws of fasting and abstinence about the true spirit of penance and to encourage them to perform acts of penance suitable to their age.

All members of the faithful are encouraged to perform acts of penance and charity beyond what is prescribed by Church law.

Stations of the Cross



Two Modern Day Prophetic Voices

Deacon John Hall's Homily from the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 13, 2022

Two Sundays ago we talked about prophets – biblical prophets like Jeremiah, Isaiah - those who felt called by God and believed they were an instrument through whom God would work and speak. And we talked about modern day prophets like Martin Luther King, Pope Francis, the Dalai Lama and Desmond Tutu . . . and I asked us to think about prophetic voices that we might listen to today. Did you think of anyone who might be a prophetic voice for us in our modern times?

How about Blessed Fr. Stanley Rother from Oklahoma who was murdered in Guatemala in 1981 who is on the way to Sainthood! Fr. Stanley was a shepherd and pastor to the people of rural Santiago, Guatemala and taught them farming & irrigation, established a school and hospital and was a refuge for the persecuted people. Martyred July 28, 1981

Another prophetic voice a little closer to home - a prophet's story that needs to be retold.

Her name is Sr. Dorothy Stang. She has visited our city of Little Rock several times. Her blood sister is Mary Heil, best friend of one of our parish matriarchs, Mary Bea Hiegel. Mary Bea and Ken have been blessed to have welcomed Sr. Dorothy, perhaps a martyr and a saint in the making, into their home. Some of you may remember the Heil family, perhaps you went to Mount or Catholic with some of the Heil children – there were nine of them – nine nieces and nephews of Sr. Dorothy.

It was because of her prophetic voice that Sr. Dorothy Stang, was silenced seventeen years ago today/yesterday with 6 bullets. On a rainy Saturday morning 17 years ago, Sr. Dorothy walked a trail in the Amazon Forest in Brazil, planning to meet with 12 peasant farmers whose huts were burned by wealthy landowners in an attempt to take their land. She was confronted by a group of men with weapons.

Sr. Dorothy, 73 years old, dressed in her usual second hand clothes and her ever-present ball cap . . . when these men brandished their weapons, Sr. Dorothy revealed hers – a bible – and she read – she read the same gospel we just heard today. And here we are, exactly 17 years later, to the day - we are reading that same reading that she, Sr. Dorothy, proclaimed on that muddy road . . . and she died for it.

For 40 years, Sr. Dorothy worked tirelessly in Brazil for the poor and she spoke out about the destruction of the environment. Like Fr. Stanley, they both lived with their names on a death list as an attempt to silence their message of the gospel. While Fr. Stanley stood up to the oppressive government, Sr. Dorothy stood in defense of land rights of the indigenous poor of the Amazon.

What outstanding examples of ordinary people, Stanley and Dorothy, who took these words of the Beatitudes to heart and brought blessings poor, the hungry and the hopeless.

As we prepare for Lent, may we come to know who are our poor, who are the marginalized, the hungry and the oppressed . . . and may we come to know how, we can bring blessings and hope to their lives.

In September 2021, Pope Francis invited Catholics worldwide to take part in the Synod on Synodality - a meeting to seek ways to walk together in spite of differences. In an effort to find out who and how and why some feel alienated from the church, the church seeks input. Why do some feel separated from the church? If you know someone who feels hurt or marginalized by the church, give them a copy of the information in the bulletin about going to our website and give some input.

I appreciate Pope Francis' and Bishop Taylor's effort to listen and learn.

Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks at his own face in a mirror. He sees himself, then goes off and promptly forgets what he looks like.

James 1: 22-24

Asking ourselves about stewardship and how we practice it, is important. It's kind of like when we have children and they play sports. When we register our child for a team at a ballpark, one of the questions on the registration form is how we want to volunteer? Do we want to coach, assistant coach, or work in the concessions stand? We have to use some of our time and talent for the park. God asks us to do the same. We need to decide what we are going to do to play ball in God's ballpark. God wants us to share our time and talents and our treasure.

If we lose sight of the true motivation for living a life of stewardship, we become a gong with no sound. The tools of stewardship, our gifts and talents and treasure exist to help us lead the right kind of life to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. We become the sum of things we do; it is about faith and works, and hearing "Well done, my faithful servant." God wants us to do these things so that we may be the witness to the transforming power of Jesus Christ, so that others may follow Jesus at work in us. The benefits of living a stewardship way of life are great for ourselves and our parish, it's about helping our fellow parishioners become the people that God has called them to become. If we live a life of stewardship, we can, by example, lead others in the right direction.

Lent is upon us. We're going to be thinking about what we're going to do for Lent or not do for Lent. A good way to start is to make a list of three things you have done for someone and the reason why God is calling you to do these things. Try this for a week and see what happens.
