

REVELATION 1:8

THE MYSTERY OF THE HOLY TRINITY

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We say these words as we make the sign of the cross, the sign of God's saving love for us in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. God who created the heavens, earth, and all who dwell in it. Jesus Christ, through whom we are offered salvation and peace. The Holy Spirit, who breathes life, leads us to the truth, and strengthens us to live as God's holy people. On this Solemnity, let us pause to reflect upon the mystery of the Holy Trinity, three persons in one God. As we name the mystery, may we come to know God's love more deeply and live it more profoundly.

PERCEIVE WHAT CANNOT BE SEEN

Have you ever paused on a clear night to look up at the stars, or taken time to notice the splendor of spring flowers, the changing colors of the autumn leaves, or the still beauty of a snow-covered landscape? Such moments of quiet reflection may lead us to a powerful sense of wonder. The same God who created the stars, flowers, trees, and snow created each of us. In sensing God's presence in the beauty that surrounds us, we may be filled with awe in perceiving what cannot be seen. Moments of wonder and awe may take us by surprise. It may be invisible, yet in these moments we see the hand of God.

LOOK WITH EYES OF FAITH

Not only in the beauty of God's creation do we sense the presence of the Lord. In times of prayer, especially the celebration of the Eucharist, we are strengthened in faith to be assured of the mystery of the triune God. The Holy Spirit guides us to the truth—the truth of who God is and who we are in God's sight. Even in times of great trial, we endure and find hope in the mystery of Christ's love—Jesus, who gave his life for us on the cross and who rose in glory is with us in times of wonder and in moments of difficulty. We see the love of God in the acts of love of others and when we act as Christ's people in service and care for others. We grow in the capacity to see with the eyes of faith, eyes that recognize God's grace and are ready to respond by sharing the love of God, Father, Son, and Spirit, in the world.

Come Holy Spirit!

Father John's Homily from Pentecost Sunday, June 5, 2022

Come Holy Spirit! This is a prayer, and invocation to God to send the Holy Spirit into our lives. Come Holy Spirit! This prayer has to come from an open heart and willingness for God to have His way within us. The classical spiritual writing "*The Cloud of Unknowing*", written in the late 14th century, talks about God's desire to love us, but our hearts have to be ready and willing to allow Him to enter in. It is a reminder of the message of John the Baptist, "Prepare the way for Jesus." Repent, turn away from sins, and be baptized so that you may be ready for God. It is the same today for any heart desiring God. Your heart must make room for God.

And we recognize the problem here: there is no room for God in our lives. We are too busy, too distracted, and too full inside. Too many things are taking our attention away from God. I find it interesting during Mass once Jesus is present, we turn to the words of John the Baptist, "Behold the Lamb of God", then it goes on, "behold Him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb." We are the ones called to the Supper of the Lamb. And we respond: "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." We pray that the Lord comes into our lives, but is there room for Him to enter?

As we come to the end of our Easter Season, we have been praying for open hearts to God's presence within. Allowing the Light of Christ's Resurrection to dispel all darkness. To trust that the Risen Lord's Ascension has given us a power and strength to withstand anything contrary to our Faith. And now to be open to all the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us be better witnesses to God's love. Now, more than ever, we must rely upon God's Spirit to lead us, guide us, teach us, empower us, inspire us, and strengthen us.

Without the openness to God's Spirit, we cannot be very fruitful witnesses to God and His kingdom. Today as we celebrate Pentecost, it is a celebration of God's outpouring of Love. In Acts of the Apostles, we find the Holy Spirit comes upon the Apostles as Jesus promised. The Holy Spirit is the love of the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit invites us to share in this community of love. And once a heart accepts God's invitation through the Holy Spirit, their lives are never the same.

Look at the difference between the disciples before and after the Pentecost. Yes, it must have been very exciting experience, tongues of fire over their heads, the mighty winds, speaking in different languages. But it is in the effect of the Holy Spirit, which makes the difference. The difference is in Courage. They are no longer afraid of anything, not of torture, prison, beating, ridicule, accusations, stoning, nothing. What a difference! They no longer fear Jewish leaders or Jewish followers. There is a noticeable difference in the Apostles, before and after Pentecost.

Jesus' followers were so filled with the Spirit of God that they felt moved to do just what Jesus did - that is to speak and bring life and love into our world. They lived this

message of Good News and shared it with others. They in turn shared it with others. Even up to this day, we now have the message to carry this same Good News to carrying God's presence into the world.

Our world needs Good News, there are reports of terrorist attacks, rising crime, guns everywhere, losing our civil liberties and the cost of keeping them, pandemic issues, the cost of gas, war, global warming, and medications out of control, and the rising cost of medical care, gas, food - the world is a scary place.

Fear is the meat and potatoes of the media, especially social media. This is in direct opposition to the Spirit of Pentecost. Our courage is based on a radical trust in God. We understand the world wasn't a bed of roses for Jesus during His time. Yet, He shows us how to put our trust in God. So we have a choice to make, and the Holy Spirit is here to help us to place our trust in God.


We choose either to allow ourselves to live in fear or to live in faith. Like Jesus to have a radical trust in our Father. We can courageously approach life one day at a time. Spirit-driven courage makes our daily living therefore a challenge, not a dread. We can step up and face a world full of fearsome things and also recognize we do so with God not by ourselves.

The fruits of the Holy Spirit are needed in our world: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. The message is in need of messengers. Are we open to allowing God's Spirit to live within us?

We have received the gifts of the Holy Spirit, both at Baptism and Confirmation, however these gifts remain dormant, like chocolate syrup at the bottom of glass of milk. In order for the chocolate to change the milk, it has to be stirred up. In order for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to change us, it has to be stirred up. Praying to the Holy Spirit, with an open heart is one way to stir up the flames of love that we have received. And to become after Pentecost Christians, not before Pentecost Christians, there is a difference.

Come, Holy Spirit – enkindle in our hearts the fire of your love and the courage to use our gifts we have received at Baptism and Confirmation. Jesus breathes on us just as He did for the Apostles, and the Holy Spirit comes upon us. Invoke the Holy Spirit, and allow God to have His ways in your life. Listen to St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit:

*Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my thoughts may all be holy.
Act in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my work, too, may be holy.
Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit,
That I love but what is holy.
Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit,
To defend all that is holy.
Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit,
That I always may be holy.*



Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always until the end of the age."

Matthew 28:18-20

At his Ascension, Jesus gives us what we call the Great Commission. The word "commission" makes this more than a suggestion or a hope. There is an expectation, a responsibility, and a mandate. Of course, did you wake up this morning thinking about how you would fulfill the Great Commission today? Sharing the faith is not just something we should do; it is something we must do. The key is that you don't need to speak all the time to share. It will be through your life of stewardship that others will be able to see Jesus. By giving of yourself, by always responding to the call, and by surrendering all to God, you will lead others to become disciples, to seek out the sacraments, and to observe His teachings. Yes, by responding in full to the Great Commission, great things can happen.

We are all called to live by the Great Commission, to make disciples of all nations. We must respond to the call to love and serve God to help get our world back on track. 


